I shot this series whilst carefully emerging from some kind of identity crisis. The photographs marked a turning point in me regaining confidence in my imagery. In a more general sense my photography, most frequently depicting the urban environment surrounding me, is a method of seeking to understand oneself and ones place within the city. I feel that a part of myself is mirrored back from the arrangement of objects within the frame somehow, that to produce a fixed image is a device to place myself and experience the notion of roots in a constantly changing landscape. I find it more intriguing to explore the external as a way to unlock feelings and emotions as opposed to explicitly narrating them from an internal point of view, however a satisfying meeting between external and internal happens when a picture is produced.
